**BIB 1303 Intro to Old Testament** An introductory survey of the Old Testament with special attention to the institutions, religious and national life of the Hebrews. *Can be substituted for MIN 1111, 1112, and 1113 in the Certificate program.*

**MIN 1131 Basic Christian History** An introductory study of the significant people and events in Christian history.

**MIN 1132 Basic Christian Doctrine** An introductory study of the great doctrines of the Christian faith.

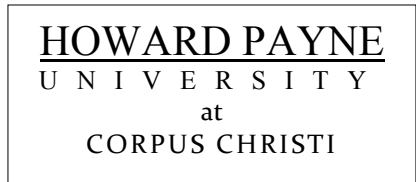

**Course Descriptions**

**BIB 1303 Introduction to the Old Testament** An introductory survey of the Old Testament with special attention to the institutions, religious and national life of the Hebrews.

**BIB 4341 General Epistles** A careful study of the epistles of James, Peter, Jude, and the Epistle to the Hebrews. Special attention will be given to the historical background of each epistle. *Prerequisite: BIB 1303, 1304, and either BIB 4391 or consent of instructor.*

**BIB 4391 Biblical Interpretation** A study of the principles of Biblical interpretation and the application of these principles to selected portions of the Bible. *Cross-Credited with PTH 4391. Prerequisite: BIB 1303, 1304.*

**BLA 2411 Elementary Greek I** An introduction to the Koine Greek of the New Testament. Primary emphasis will be given to learning the Greek verb system. Attention will also be given to the case system and to the acquisition of a limited vocabulary. *Prerequisite: BIB 1303, 1304 or sophomore standing.*

**CCS 2189 Cross-Cultural Ministry Workshop** Selected topics related to cross-cultural ministry will be addressed in a workshop format. Speakers experienced in cross-cultural ministry will share their insights about specific cultures and/or approaches to minister within their cultures.

**CCS 3360 Foundations for Cross-Cultural Ministry** An introduction to the biblical basis for cross-cultural ministry with special emphasis given to mission strategy and education in the church. *Cross-credited with PTH 3360 and CED 3360. Prerequisite: BIB 1303, BIB 1304, and either CCS 3360 or consent of instructor.*

**CED 2350 Survey of Youth Education** A study of the historical background and development of youth education in the local church. Emphasis will be given to program organizations, literature and methods of Christian education for youth. *Cross-credited with YMN 2350. Prerequisite: Sophomore standing.*

**MIN 1131 Basic Christian History** An introductory study of the significant people and events in Christian history.

**MIN 1132 Basic Christian Doctrine** An introductory study of the great doctrines of the Christian faith.

**Course Descriptions**

**BIBL 6311 Interpreting the New Testament I** Introduction to the interpretation of the New Testament focusing on background issues, interpretive methodologies, biblical content, and theological implications for the church.

**CHST 6099 Advanced Church History: First Millennium Church** A study of post-New Testament Christian Heritage, including its major figures, theological developments, literature, mission, and cultural impact through its first 1000 years. *Video Conference Course.*

**GREK 6099 Greek Readings I** Exegetical readings of selected Greek passages from the New Testament with readings in other selected Greek texts including significant grammatical study, research, and writing. *Prerequisite: One year of Elementary Greek or equivalent.*

**HEBR 6302 Biblical Hebrew II** Accelerated introduction to biblical Hebrew, focusing on grammar, vocabulary, syntax, and translation. *Prerequisite: HEBR 6301.*

**MISS 6301 Christian Approaches to Other Faiths** Examination of various Christian attitudes toward other religions. Includes secular views about religion in general, as well as non-Christian perspectives concerning Christianity. Also focuses upon the nature and role of inter-religious dialogue. *Cross-listed as THEO 6099.*

**MNST 6000 Spiritual Formation Colloquium** A consideration of the spiritual formation of the minister through the experience of corporate worship, guided theological reflection and dialogue with the graduate theological community.

**MNST 6270 Worship Leadership** An advanced study of the biblical and theological foundations, historical development, and contemporary expressions of Christian worship. Consideration will be given to the skills essential for effective worship leadership in a local congregation.

**MNST 6300 Communication in Ministry** Study of the principles of effective communications as they related to ministry in the local congregation. Included will be the principles of preparation and delivery of sermons and Bible studies as well as communication through other media, such as writing, drama, radio/television, and the Internet.

**THEO 6099 Advanced Systematic Theology I** An advanced study of theology focused on Christology and soteriology. *Prerequisite: THEO 6300. Online Course.*

**THEO 6099 Ethics and the Local Church** A normative definition of the Church expressed in Biblical and theological terms will be developed along with an identification of the many cultural contexts in which the 21<sup>st</sup> century Church finds herself. These contexts become callings for the Church to implement her message of Good News which comes in the form of justice and love. Therefore, strategies and tactics for delivering the Good News will be examined and considered for implementation.

**THEO 6202 Spiritual Formation** A study of the biblical and theological principles for the development of a mature spiritual life. Attention will be given to classic works of spiritual devotion as well as contemporary writings and movements which focus on the development of spiritual disciplines.

**THEO 6260/6360 Ecclesiology: The Doctrine of the Church** A study of the biblical and theological foundations for understanding the nature and role of the church and its significance for Christian life and through. May be taken as either a 2-hour or 3-hour course. *Prerequisite: THEO 6351 and 6352 or instructor's permission.*
